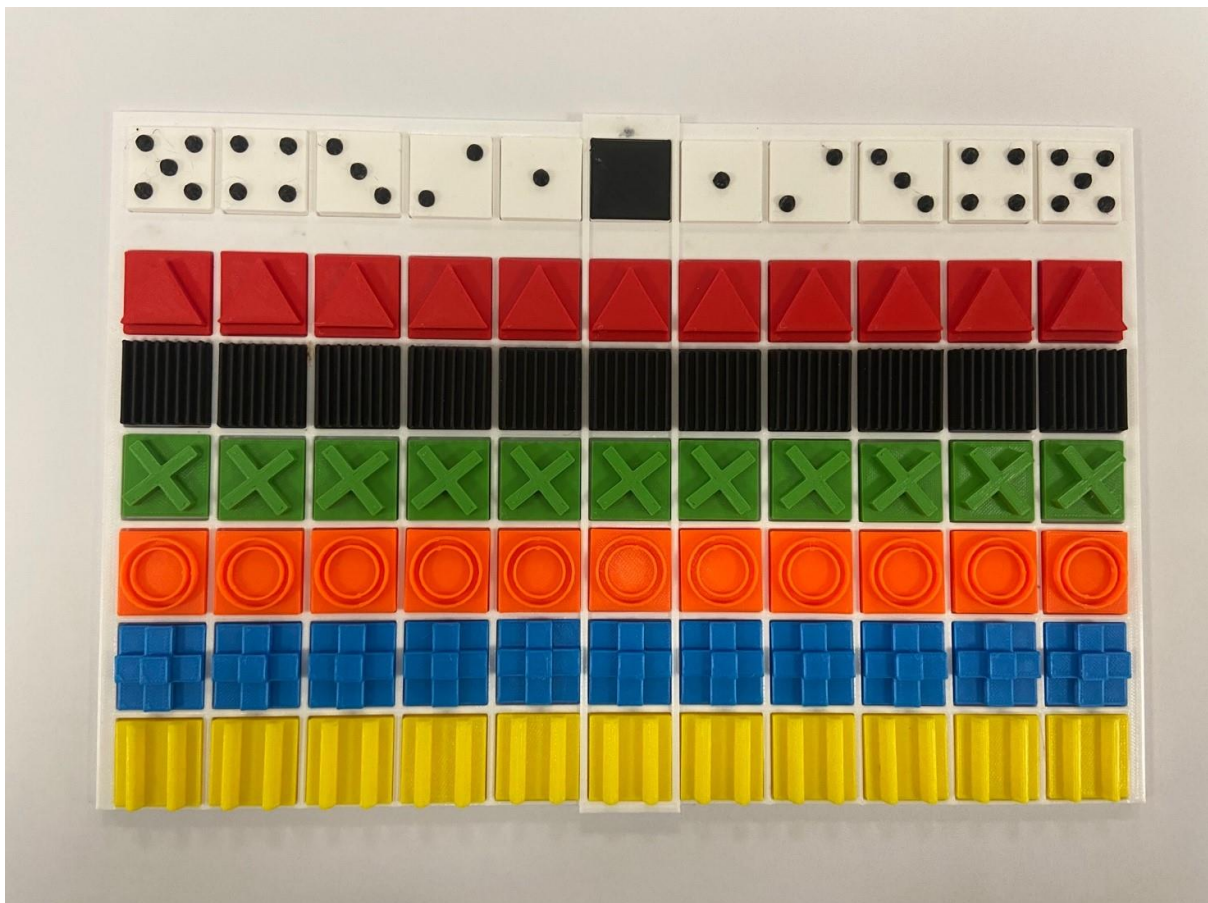


## Encore: Rules of the game

Number of players 1 – 2

## Materials

- 1 or 2 gameboards
- 1 dice
- 132 with structure and colour (for 2 boards)
  - 22 light blue blocks
  - 22 orange circle
  - 22 red triangle
  - 22 green crosses
  - 22 Yellow beams
  - 22 black stripes
  - 22 tiles with dots 1 - 5



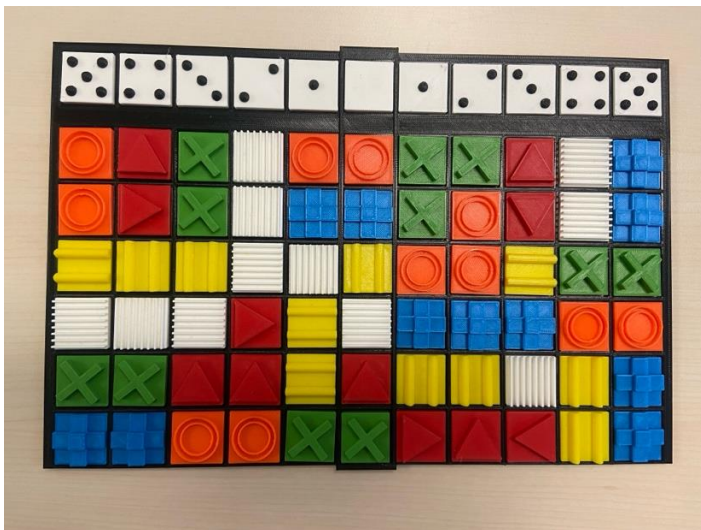
## The game

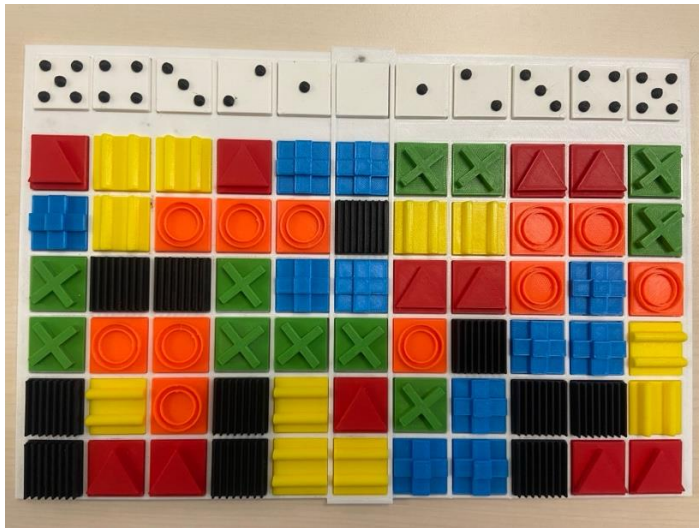
The goal of the game is to collect as much points as you can by collecting tiles or clearing out a full column for bonus points. Players throw the dice and you may collect the tiles corresponding to the texture it lands on.

## Preparations

Start by setting up the board. You can fill the board your own way of use one of the pictures below. The middle row should include all 6 different tiles. Also decide on a play on the table for the player to put their tiles after collecting.

You can play by yourself or with more people. 2 players can play on one board or both have their own.







## Game progress

The player with the largest feet may start the game. At the start you must start collecting from the middle row. After this you can only collect tiles from the middle or row that are connected to an open space. When tiles of the same type are connected, you can collect all.

During the game it can happen that there are no available/connecting tiles matching your dice roll. When this happens, the turn passes to the next person.

## Scoring

Every colored/textured tile is worth one point.

The first player to clear a column gets bonus points by taking the point tile from the top row. If you are playing on multiple boards the other persons also take the point tile from the same column but discards this from the game. Bonus points can only be collected once per column.

If you are the first one to collect all tiles from one color/texture, you are awarded 3 bonus points.

## The end

The game is over the turn when one person only has two colors/textures left.

Count your tiles and bonus points! Each tile is worth one point and the bonus are worth 1 – 5 points based on the amount of dots.

The fastest way to count your points is to count the number of tiles left on your board. Deduct this from 66 (the total amount of tiles on a board) and you have the number of tiles you collected. Add the bonus points from the column or the colors you were first to collect, and you have your final score.

The person with the highest score wins! Congratulations
